A number of tree plantation drives have been organized on Van Mahotsav and other occasions by the NSS and NCC students with the help of Teachers. The college has 05 (five) gardens with variety of plants. College has a compost pit in which organic matter is converted to manure. College has 'Science Forum' which has taken upon itself the onus to spread awareness on various pressing environmental issues through posters and displays. Recently a "No to Plastic" campaign was organized by Science Forum to make the campus free of plastic.

Weakness:

- Infrastructural constraints, like inadequate no of classrooms, no separate library building with modern facilities, no separate well equipped conference room
- Shortage of faculty members.
- Shortage of ministerial Staff.
- Bio-science stream and commerce are yet to be introduced.
- There is no hostel facility for girls.
- Periodical training programme for the administration staff to be organized.
- Good transport facilities for students are lacking.
- Lack of academic and administrative autonomy
- Recruitment and transfer of faculty and office staff is controlled by State Govt. policy and for that often there is shortage of teacher and non-teaching staff.

Opportunities:

- The college has large campus area to develop/build new infrastructure with financial support from UGC/RUSA/State Grants, to accommodate new programmes in future.
- The college has ample opportunities to obtain funds from different agencies- like UGC/RUSA/ICSSR/DST/DBT to organize seminars, workshop or to procure books and journals.
- The faculty members have the opportunity to attend faculty development programs like Orientation Course, Refreshment courses etc.
- The faculty members have the opportunity to pursue Ph.D. work on part time basis in different University as per Govt. rule & also to carry out minor or major Research Project under UGC.
- The students have the opportunities to available library facilities with internet.

Challenges:

- To equip our students to make themselves fit for their challenging future.
- To provide modern facilities and techniques in the field of teaching and learning.
- To arrange or organize more faculty training programme so that they can deal with their students with the best practices.
- To counsel those students, who can not maintain regularity in attendance.
- To build the attitude of social service in the young generation through different programs.

Plantation drive in the College campus

Goal

To develop awareness among students about plants and inculcate in them values of conservation of biodiversity while making the campus eco-friendly.

The Context

The college has a vast campus area of 32.5 acre much of which is free space and without considerable number of trees. The vegetation is composed mostly of shrubs and herbs natural as well as planted. This offered a great scope for planting avenue tree species as well as surveying and charting out the existing vegetation involving students which can develop awareness among students about plants and inculcate in them values of conservation of biodiversity while making the campus eco-friendly.

The Practice

The College conducted tree planting programmes throughout the year in the campus with active involvement of NSS, NCC volunteers and the students from other departments.
